



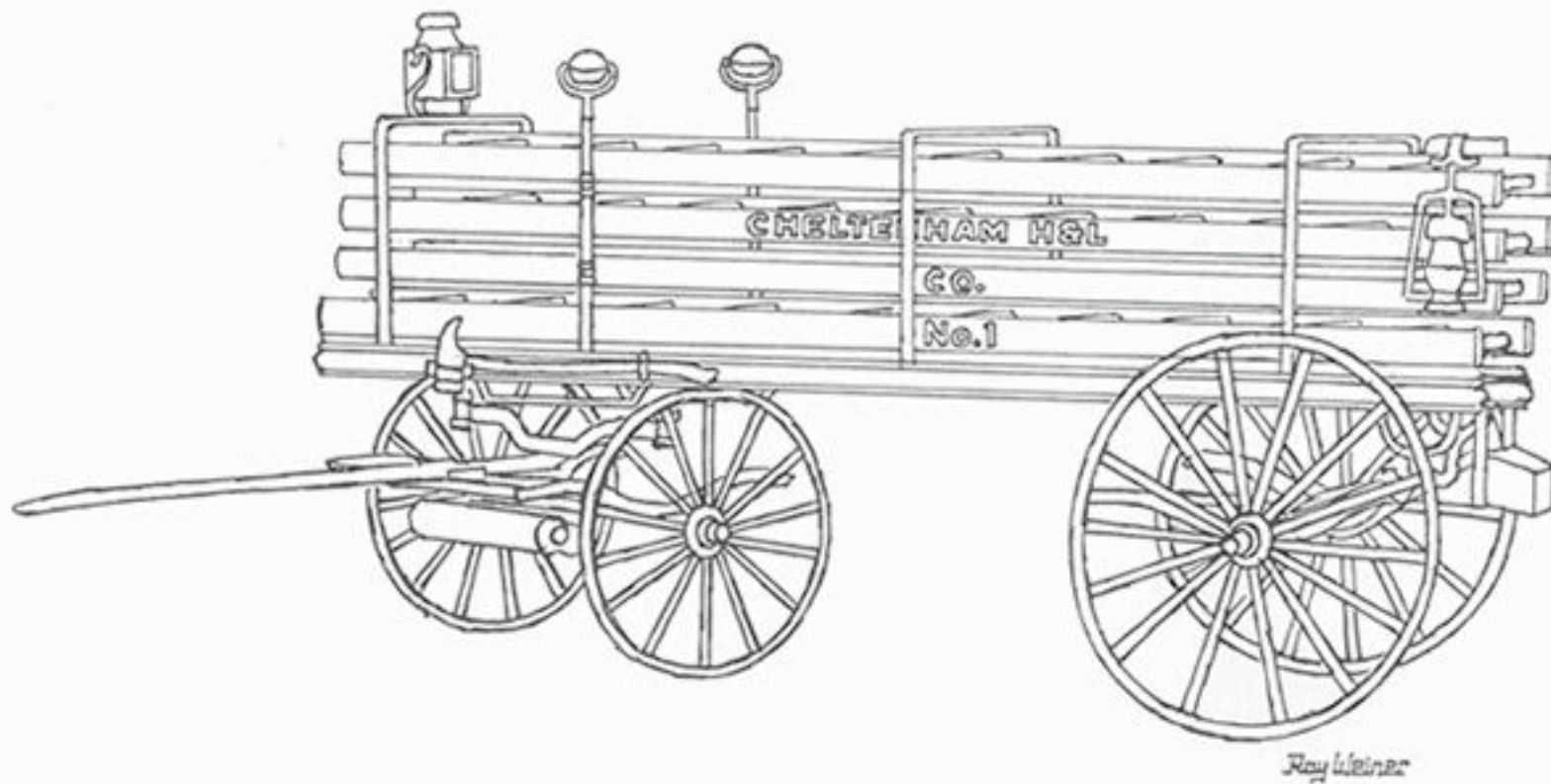

Cheltenham Hook & Ladder Company was founded September 21, 1896.

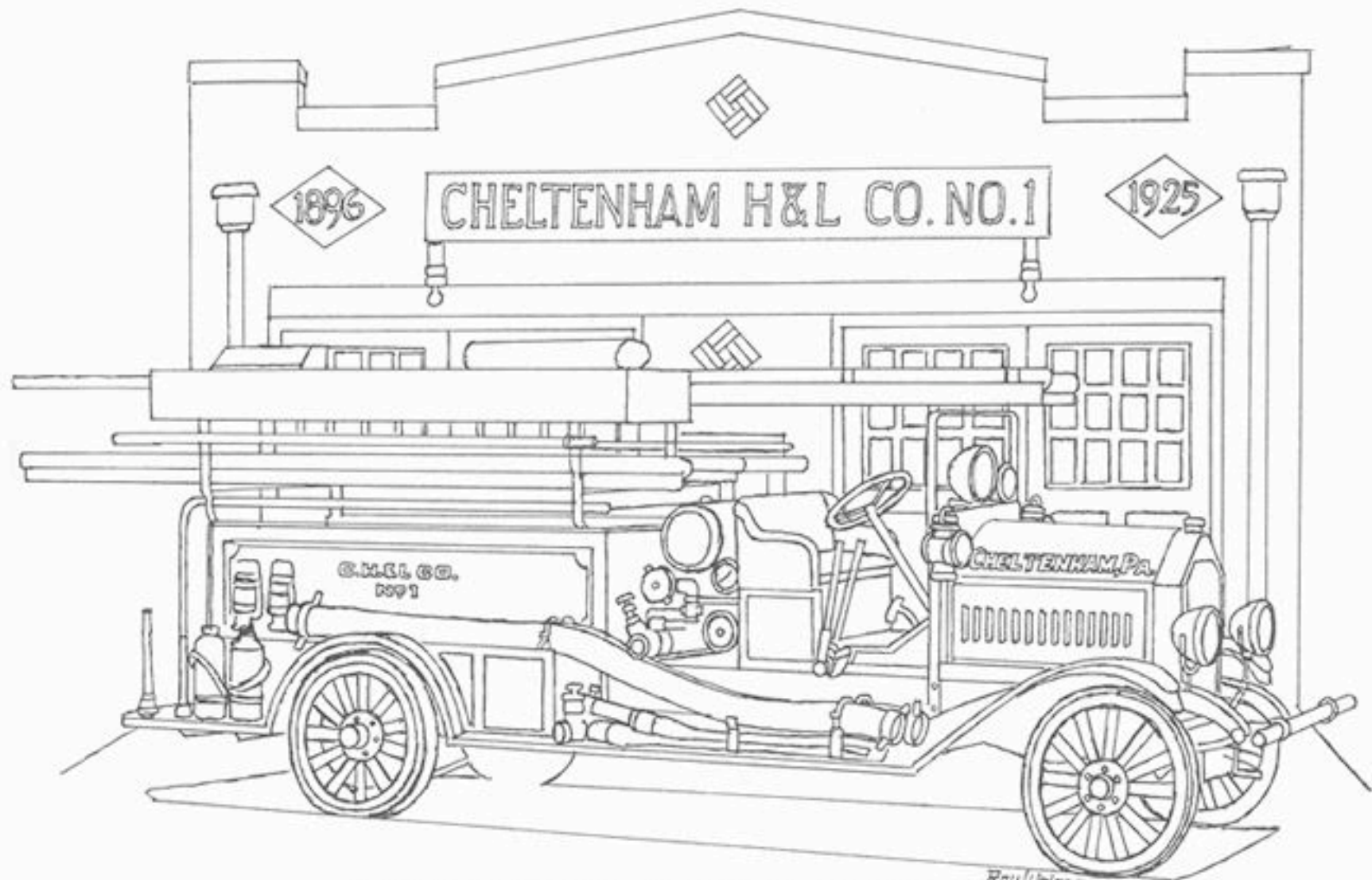
The original firehouse was located at 514 Ryers Avenue.

The first apparatus was a "Hand Drawn Ladder Wagon".
It was purchased from Gleason-Baily MFG. Co. of Seneca Falls New York.

The first motorized apparatus was this 1916 Bishop Pumper.

It was later modified to carry ladders as shown here in front of the old firehouse.

Make sure you know two ways out of each room in your home!



The current firehouse is located at 413 Ryers Avenue.
As it appears today with Engine 4, Tower Ladder 4, and Engine 4-1.

If fire strikes "GET OUT" once your out "STAY OUT"!

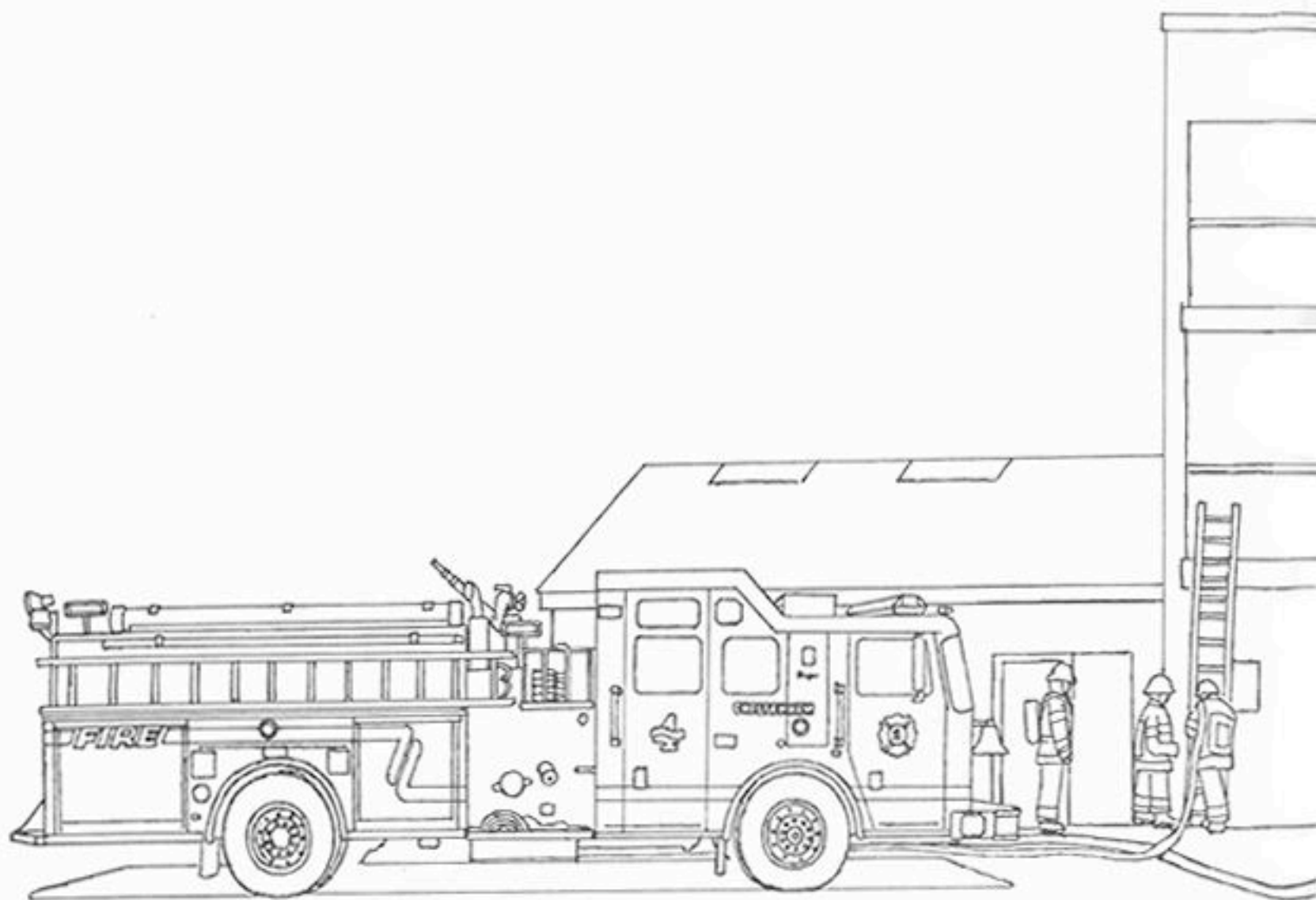


Engine 4 is a 2000 Seagrave Pumper with a 1,500-Gallon Per Minute Pump.

It is our newest apparatus and carries 600 gallons of water.

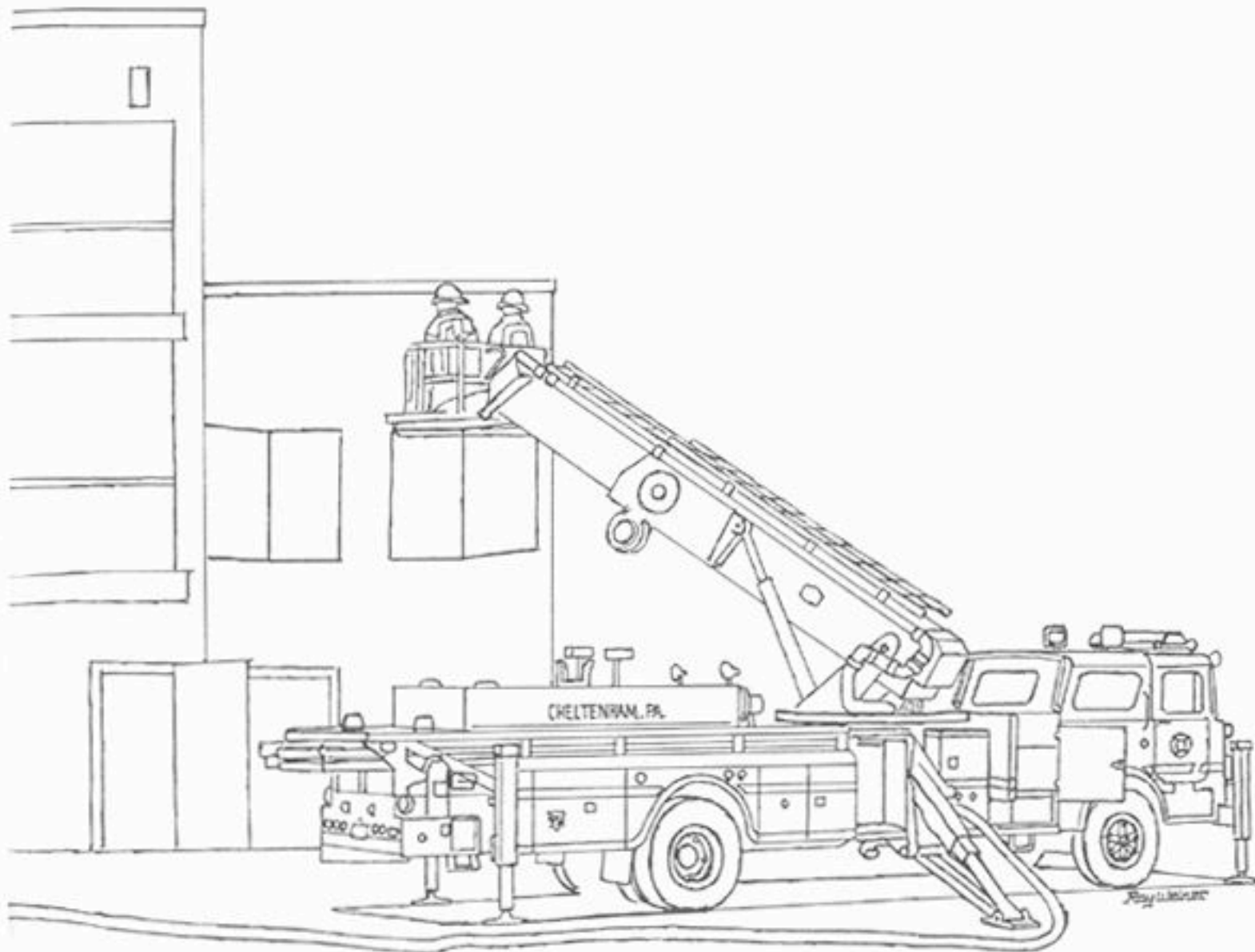
This pumper is equipped with an Automatic External Defibrillator and a Thermal Imaging Camera.

Be sure the whole family knows where to meet outside!

Install smoke detectors on every floor of your home!

Install and maintain a Carbon Monoxide detector in your home!



Tower Ladder 4 is a 1971 Mack Aerial Scope with a 75 foot elevating platform. It is capable of flowing a 1,000 gallons per minute and carries 227 foot of ground ladders.

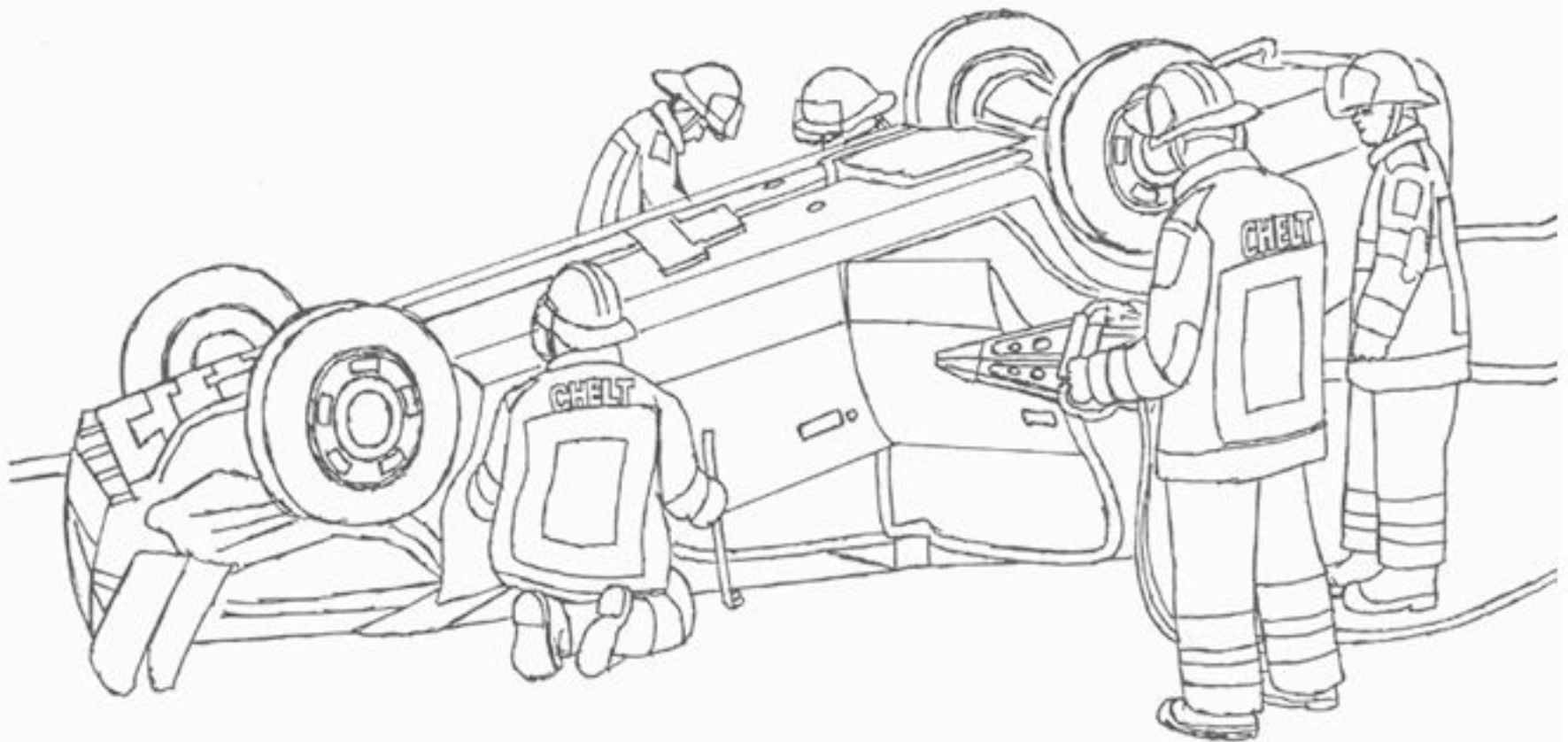
A smoke detector could save your life but only if it works!



Special Service 4 is a 1986 Ford E-350.

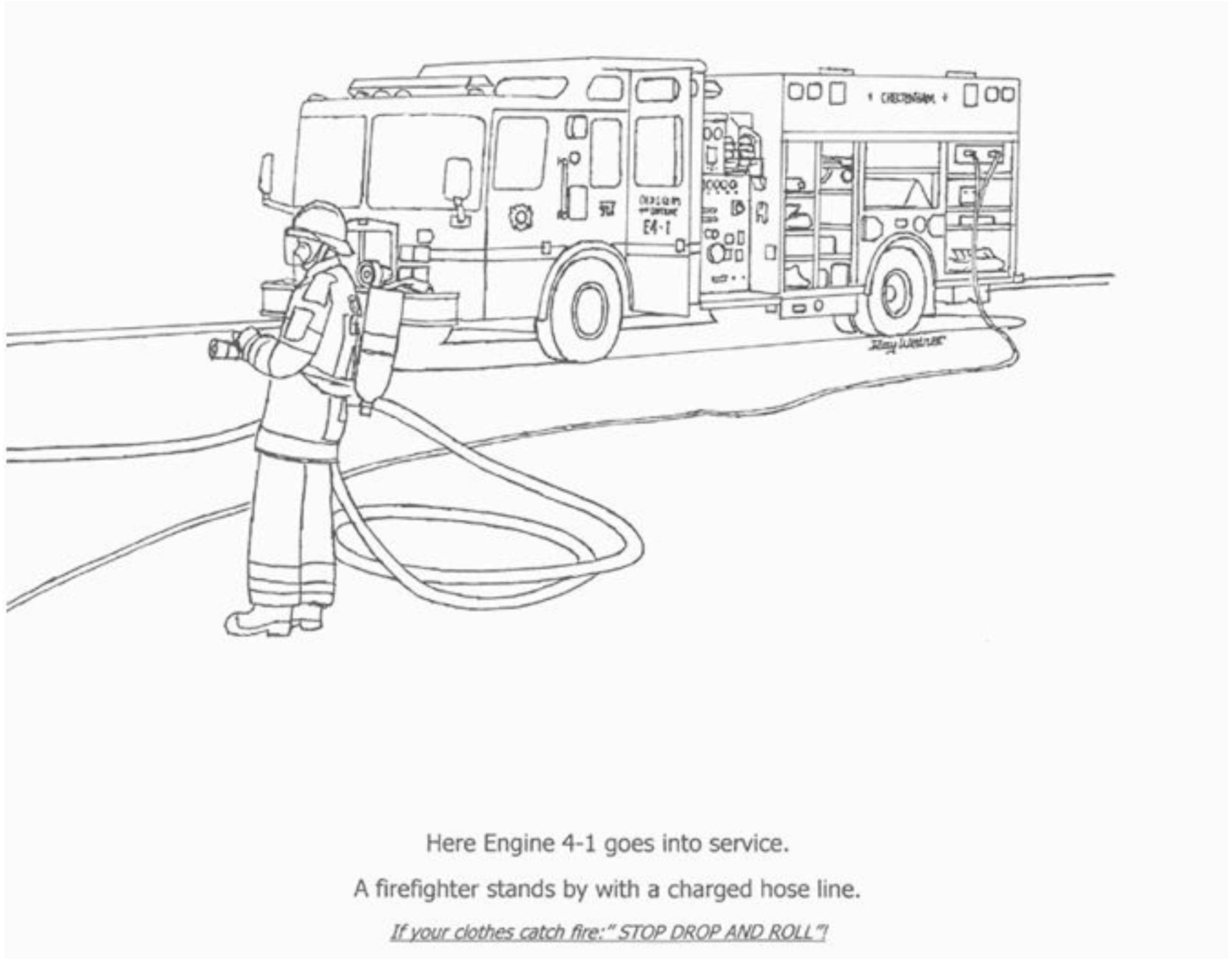
This apparatus is used as a support vehicle transporting manpower and equipment.

Test detectors monthly and replace week or dead batteries!



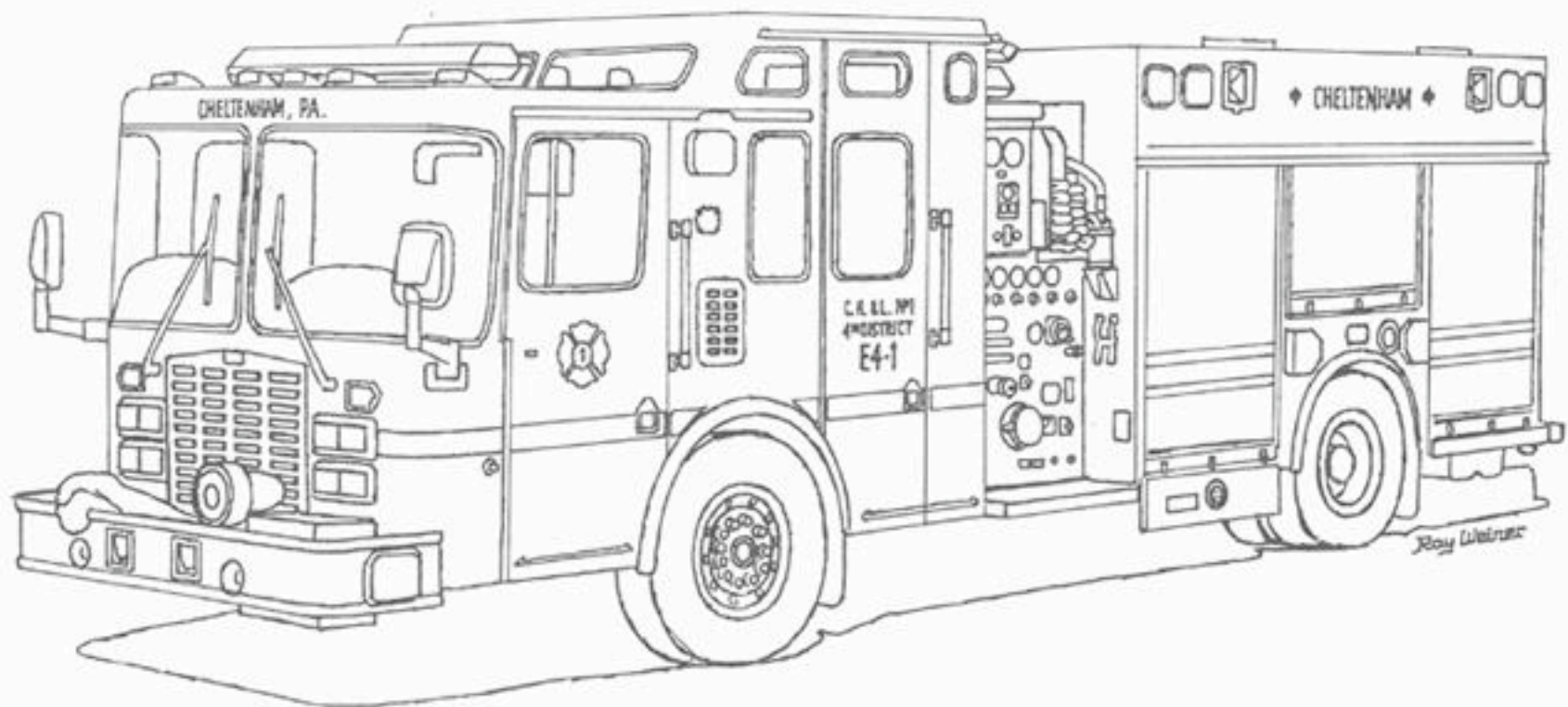
Firefighters stabilize an overturned car, and use "The Jaws of Life" to gain access to the victim.

Never play with matches or a lighter!



Here Engine 4-1 goes into service.
A firefighter stands by with a charged hose line.

If your clothes catch fire: "STOP DROP AND ROLL!"



Engine 4-1 is a 1996 HME/Saulsbury Rescue Pumper with a 1,250-Gallon Per Minute Pump.

It is equipped with Hurst Jaws of Life rescue tools.

This engine carries 600 gallons of water along with 25 gallons each of Class A and B foam.

Clean Chimneys and place screens in front of fireplaces!



Our Firefighters are volunteers, who do not get paid. They are "on call" 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
